

## Prehistoric Art



Welcome to the Eagle High School art gallery. There are **twelve (12) viewing stations** and **one (1) video station** located in our gallery today. You will need to work in a team with someone who has a smartphone and a QR reader app today.

## Art Gallery Etiquette

1. Most art museums and galleries **only allow pencils** inside the gallery for sketching, so that any marks made on artwork can be re-

moved (which is an absolute no-no!).

- 2. **Do not touch the artwork,** and **keep a reasonable distance from the artwork** (two to three feet). This helps protect the artwork from touching, scribbling, and even your breath, which can deteriorate the work.
- 3. **Whisper or use a quiet voice** inside a gallery or museum, so that you do not disturb others.
- 4. **Read the labels** or any material posted by an artwork, as it may help you understand the piece better.
- 5. **Ask the guides or curators** if you have any questions.
